## HONORING BETTY GLOVER

Local 1 Honorary Life Member Betty Glover, retired bass trombone player of the Cincinnati Symphony Orchestra, celebrated her 99th birthday on January 24, 2022, at the retirement facility where she resides in Menerbes, France. As well as a distinguished performing career with the CSO that extended from 1952 until 1985, Betty was renowned as a teacher of many successful musicians during her years as a faculty member of the University of Cincinnati College Conservatory of Music. She conducted the CCM Brass Ensemble for many years and brought a sense of excellence and humility to all her activities. She was awarded a Dean's Medal from CCM last April, details found here. Betty responded, typically, that she thought she was "just doing her job." A lifetime "Francophile," Betty made trips to her beloved Provence region of France, where she bought property prior to her retirement. Honorary Life Member, former colleague, and devoted friend Marie Speziale has been exerting great efforts to help **Betty** with personal and business details, as a key member of a support group in France for **Betty** has recently passed away.
